Frank Aguilar – 228th District Court

Detained:

- **84% of Black defendants (92 out of 111)**
- **64% of Hispanic White defendants (29 out of 45)**
- **51% of non-Hispanic White defendants (42 out of 81)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Frank Aguilar** detained **84% of Black defendants (92 out of 111 on an average night)**, **64% of Hispanic White defendants (29 out of 45 on an average night)**, and **51% of non-Hispanic White defendants (42 out of 81 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Aguilar's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **25% worst** in Harris County. His **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% worst** in Harris County.
