Frank Aguilar – 228th District Court

Detained:

- **83% of Black defendants (82 out of 99)**
- **63% of Hispanic White defendants (22 out of 35)**
- **48% of non-Hispanic White defendants (38 out of 80)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, Judge Frank Aguilar detained **83% of Black defendants (82 out of 99 on an average night)**, **63% of Hispanic White defendants (22 out of 35 on an average night)**, and **48% of non-Hispanic White defendants (38 out of 80 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Aguilar's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **25% worst** in Harris County. His **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **25% worst** in Harris County.
