Frank Aguilar – 228th District Court

Detained:

- **82% of Black defendants (88 out of 107)**
- **55% of Hispanic White defendants (23 out of 42)**
- **48% of non-Hispanic White defendants (42 out of 87)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Frank Aguilar** detained **82% of Black defendants (88 out of 107 on an average night)**, **55% of Hispanic White defendants (23 out of 42 on an average night)**, and **48% of non-Hispanic White defendants (42 out of 87 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Aguilar's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **25% worst** in Harris County. His **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% best** in Harris County.
