Abigail Anastasio – 184th District Court

Detained:

- **77% of Black defendants (102 out of 132)**
- **71% of Hispanic White defendants (25 out of 36)**
- **52% of non-Hispanic White defendants (58 out of 110)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Abigail Anastasio** detained 77% of Black defendants (102 out of 132 on an average night), 71% of Hispanic White defendants (25 out of 36 on an average night), and 52% of non-Hispanic White defendants (58 out of 110 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Anastasio's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the 50% worst in Harris County. Her **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the 25% worst in Harris County.
