Detained:

- 80% of Black defendants (109 out of 137)
- 74% of Hispanic White defendants (26 out of 35)
- 52% of non-Hispanic White defendants (59 out of 114)

Last week, Judge Abigail Anastasio detained 80% of Black defendants (109 out of 137 on an average night), 74% of Hispanic White defendants (26 out of 35 on an average night), and 52% of non-Hispanic White defendants (59 out of 114 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Anastasio's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% worst in Harris County. Her racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% worst in Harris County.
