Lori Chambers Gray – 262nd District Court

Detained:

- **77% of Black defendants (110 out of 144)**
- **46% of Hispanic White defendants (24 out of 53)**
- **54% of non-Hispanic White defendants (61 out of 113)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, Judge Lori Chambers Gray detained 77% of Black defendants (110 out of 144 on an average night), 46% of Hispanic White defendants (24 out of 53 on an average night), and 54% of non-Hispanic White defendants (61 out of 113 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Gray's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% worst in Harris County. Her racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% best in Harris County.
