Lori Chambers Gray – 262nd District Court

Detained:

- **76% of Black defendants (112 out of 148)**
- **40% of Hispanic White defendants (21 out of 52)**
- **55% of non-Hispanic White defendants (65 out of 117)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, Judge Lori Chambers Gray detained 76% of Black defendants (112 out of 148 on an average night), 40% of Hispanic White defendants (21 out of 52 on an average night), and 55% of non-Hispanic White defendants (65 out of 117 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Gray's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% best in Harris County. Her racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% worst in Harris County.
