Lori Chambers Gray – 262nd District Court

Detained:

- **78% of Black defendants (137 out of 177)**
- **38% of Hispanic White defendants (18 out of 49)**
- **50% of non-Hispanic White defendants (58 out of 116)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, Judge Lori Chambers Gray detained 78% of Black defendants (137 out of 177 on an average night), 38% of Hispanic White defendants (18 out of 49 on an average night), and 50% of non-Hispanic White defendants (58 out of 116 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Gray's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% worst in Harris County. Her racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% worst in Harris County.
