Josh Hill – 232nd District Court

Detained:

- **75% of Black defendants (92 out of 123)**
- **62% of Hispanic White defendants (36 out of 58)**
- **52% of non-Hispanic White defendants (45 out of 87)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Josh Hill** detained **75% of Black defendants (92 out of 123 on an average night)**, **62% of Hispanic White defendants (36 out of 58 on an average night)**, and **52% of non-Hispanic White defendants (45 out of 87 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Hill's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% worst** in Harris County. His **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% worst** in Harris County.
