Josh Hill – 232nd District Court

Detained:

- **78% of Black defendants (113 out of 145)**
- **59% of Hispanic White defendants (35 out of 59)**
- **50% of non-Hispanic White defendants (51 out of 102)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Josh Hill** detained **78% of Black defendants (113 out of 145 on an average night)**, **59% of Hispanic White defendants (35 out of 59 on an average night)**, and **50% of non-Hispanic White defendants (51 out of 102 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Hill's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **25% worst** in Harris County. His **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% best** in Harris County.
