Amy Martin – 263rd District Court

Detained:

- **72% of Black defendants (86 out of 119)**
- **75% of Hispanic White defendants (37 out of 50)**
- **63% of non-Hispanic White defendants (55 out of 87)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Amy Martin** detained **72% of Black defendants (86 out of 119 on an average night)**, **75% of Hispanic White defendants (37 out of 50 on an average night)**, and **63% of non-Hispanic White defendants (55 out of 87 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Martin's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **25% best** in Harris County. Her **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% worst** in Harris County.
