Amy Martin – 263rd District Court

Detained:

- **74% of Black defendants (88 out of 119)**
- **74% of Hispanic White defendants (36 out of 49)**
- **64% of non-Hispanic White defendants (56 out of 88)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Amy Martin** detained **74% of Black defendants (88 out of 119 on an average night)**, **74% of Hispanic White defendants (36 out of 49 on an average night)**, and **64% of non-Hispanic White defendants (56 out of 88 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Martin's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **25% best** in Harris County. Her **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% worst** in Harris County.
