## Amy Martin – 263<sup>rd</sup> District Court

Detained:

- **74% of Black defendants (87 out of 118)**
- **71% of Hispanic White defendants (32 out of 45)**
- **63% of non-Hispanic White defendants (54 out of 85)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Amy Martin** detained **74% of Black defendants (87 out of 118 on an average night)**, **71% of Hispanic White defendants (32 out of 45 on an average night)**, and **63% of non-Hispanic White defendants (54 out of 85 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Martin's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **25% best** in Harris County. Her **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% best** in Harris County.
