Amy Martin – 263rd District Court

Detained:

- **76% of Black defendants (97 out of 128)**
- **72% of Hispanic White defendants (40 out of 56)**
- **61% of non-Hispanic White defendants (53 out of 87)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Amy Martin** detained **76% of Black defendants (97 out of 128 on an average night)**, **72% of Hispanic White defendants (40 out of 56 on an average night)**, and **61% of non-Hispanic White defendants (53 out of 87 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Martin's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **25% best** in Harris County. Her **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% worst** in Harris County.
