- 69% of Hispanic White defendants (38 out of 54)
- 61% of non-Hispanic White defendants (54 out of 88)

Last week, Judge Amy Martin detained 76% of Black defendants (102 out of 134 on an average night), 69% of Hispanic White defendants (38 out of 54 on an average night), and 61% of non-Hispanic White defendants (54 out of 88 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Martin's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% best in Harris County. Her racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% best in Harris County.
