## Jesse McClure, III – 339<sup>th</sup> District Court

Detained:

- **79% of Black defendants (127 out of 161)**
- **59% of Hispanic White defendants (31 out of 53)**
- **61% of non-Hispanic White defendants (62 out of 101)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Jesse McClure, III** detained **79% of Black defendants (127 out of 161 on an average night)**, **59% of Hispanic White defendants (31 out of 53 on an average night)**, and **61% of non-Hispanic White defendants (62 out of 101 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge McClure's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% best** in Harris County. His **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **25% best** in Harris County.
