## Jesse McClure, III – 339<sup>th</sup> District Court

Detained:

- **80% of Black defendants (127 out of 160)**
- **58% of Hispanic White defendants (29 out of 51)**
- **62% of non-Hispanic White defendants (65 out of 105)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, Judge Jesse McClure, III detained 80% of Black defendants (127 out of 160 on an average night), 58% of Hispanic White defendants (29 out of 51 on an average night), and 62% of non-Hispanic White defendants (65 out of 105 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge McClure's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% best in Harris County. His racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% best in Harris County.
