Jesse McClure, III – 339th District Court

Detained:

- **80% of Black defendants (126 out of 159)**
- **59% of Hispanic White defendants (31 out of 53)**
- **60% of non-Hispanic White defendants (64 out of 107)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, Judge Jesse McClure, III detained 80% of Black defendants (126 out of 159 on an average night), 59% of Hispanic White defendants (31 out of 53 on an average night), and 60% of non-Hispanic White defendants (64 out of 107 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge McClure's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% best in Harris County. His racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% best in Harris County.
