## Jesse McClure, III – 339<sup>th</sup> District Court

Detained:

- **77% of Black defendants (119 out of 154)**
- **61% of Hispanic White defendants (29 out of 48)**
- **59% of non-Hispanic White defendants (60 out of 101)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, Judge Jesse McClure, III detained 77% of Black defendants (119 out of 154 on an average night), 61% of Hispanic White defendants (29 out of 48 on an average night), and 59% of non-Hispanic White defendants (60 out of 101 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge McClure's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% best in Harris County. His racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% best in Harris County.
