## Detained:

- 78% of Black defendants (115 out of 148)
- 63% of Hispanic White defendants (28 out of 45)
- 58% of non-Hispanic White defendants (58 out of 100)

Last week, Judge Jesse McClure, III detained 78% of Black defendants (115 out of 148 on an average night), 63% of Hispanic White defendants (28 out of 45 on an average night), and 58% of non-Hispanic White defendants (58 out of 100 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge McClure's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% worst in Harris County. His racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% best in Harris County.
