Jesse McClure, III – 339th District Court

Detained:

- **78% of Black defendants (128 out of 164)**
- **63% of Hispanic White defendants (29 out of 47)**
- **58% of non-Hispanic White defendants (65 out of 112)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, Judge Jesse McClure, III detained 78% of Black defendants (128 out of 164 on an average night), 63% of Hispanic White defendants (29 out of 47 on an average night), and 58% of non-Hispanic White defendants (65 out of 112 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge McClure's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% worst in Harris County. His racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% best in Harris County.
