Jesse McClure, III – 339th District Court

Detained:

- **79% of Black defendants (131 out of 167)**
- **64% of Hispanic White defendants (32 out of 49)**
- **56% of non-Hispanic White defendants (62 out of 112)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, Judge Jesse McClure, III detained 79% of Black defendants (131 out of 167 on an average night), 64% of Hispanic White defendants (32 out of 49 on an average night), and 56% of non-Hispanic White defendants (62 out of 112 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge McClure's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% worst in Harris County. His racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% best in Harris County.
