Jesse McClure, III – 339th District Court

Detained:

- **78% of Black defendants (136 out of 175)**
- **61% of Hispanic White defendants (30 out of 49)**
- **57% of non-Hispanic White defendants (65 out of 113)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Jesse McClure, III** detained **78% of Black defendants (136 out of 175 on an average night)**, **61% of Hispanic White defendants (30 out of 49 on an average night)**, and **57% of non-Hispanic White defendants (65 out of 113 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge McClure's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% best** in Harris County. His **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **25% best** in Harris County.
