## Jesse McClure, III – 339<sup>th</sup> District Court

Detained:

- **76% of Black defendants (133 out of 175)**
- **63% of Hispanic White defendants (32 out of 51)**
- **57% of non-Hispanic White defendants (66 out of 116)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Jesse McClure, III** detained **76% of Black defendants (133 out of 175 on an average night)**, **63% of Hispanic White defendants (32 out of 51 on an average night)**, and **57% of non-Hispanic White defendants (66 out of 116 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge McClure's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% best** in Harris County. His **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% best** in Harris County.
