Jesse McClure, III – 339th District Court

Detained:

- **77% of Black defendants (136 out of 177)**
- **64% of Hispanic White defendants (33 out of 51)**
- **58% of non-Hispanic White defendants (64 out of 111)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Jesse McClure, III** detained **77% of Black defendants (136 out of 177 on an average night)**, **64% of Hispanic White defendants (33 out of 51 on an average night)**, and **58% of non-Hispanic White defendants (64 out of 111 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge McClure's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% best** in Harris County. His **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% best** in Harris County.
