## Randy Roll – 179<sup>th</sup> District Court

Detained:

- **78% of Black defendants (112 out of 144)**
- **53% of Hispanic White defendants (22 out of 42)**
- **54% of non-Hispanic White defendants (58 out of 108)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Randy Roll** detained **78% of Black defendants (112 out of 144 on an average night)**, **53% of Hispanic White defendants (22 out of 42 on an average night)**, and **54% of non-Hispanic White defendants (58 out of 108 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Roll's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% worst** in Harris County. His **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **25% best** in Harris County.
