Randy Roll – 179th District Court

Detained:

- **79% of Black defendants (122 out of 155)**
- **60% of Hispanic White defendants (31 out of 51)**
- **54% of non-Hispanic White defendants (62 out of 115)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, **Judge Randy Roll** detained **79% of Black defendants (122 out of 155 on an average night)**, **60% of Hispanic White defendants (31 out of 51 on an average night)**, and **54% of non-Hispanic White defendants (62 out of 115 on an average night)** in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Roll's **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% worst** in Harris County. His **racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants** is among the **50% best** in Harris County.
