Brian Warren – 209th District Court

Detained:

- **78% of Black defendants (117 out of 150)**
- **58% of Hispanic White defendants (24 out of 41)**
- **50% of non-Hispanic White defendants (52 out of 102)**

per night based on inability to pay

Last week, Judge Brian Warren detained 78% of Black defendants (117 out of 150 on an average night), 58% of Hispanic White defendants (24 out of 41 on an average night), and 50% of non-Hispanic White defendants (52 out of 102 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Warren's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% worst in Harris County. His racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% best in Harris County.
