Detained:

- 80% of Black defendants (116 out of 144)
- 65% of Hispanic White defendants (28 out of 43)
- 52% of non-Hispanic White defendants (48 out of 93)

Last week, Judge Brian Warren detained 80% of Black defendants (116 out of 144 on an average night), 65% of Hispanic White defendants (28 out of 43 on an average night), and 52% of non-Hispanic White defendants (48 out of 93 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Warren's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% worst in Harris County. His racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% worst in Harris County.
