- 81% of Black defendants (148 out of 182)
- 61% of Hispanic White defendants (28 out of 46)
- 52% of non-Hispanic White defendants (61 out of 116)

Last week, Judge Brian Warren detained 81% of Black defendants (148 out of 182 on an average night), 61% of Hispanic White defendants (28 out of 46 on an average night), and 52% of non-Hispanic White defendants (61 out of 116 on an average night) in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Warren's racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% worst in Harris County. His racial difference in pretrial detention rates for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% worst in Harris County.
