
Among current pretrial jail inmates assigned to Judge Chambers Gray:

- 76% of Black defendants (112 out of 148)
- 40% of Hispanic White defendants (21 out of 52)
- 55% of non-Hispanic White defendants (65 out of 117)

were detained per night based on inability to pay

Last week, among current pretrial jail inmates assigned to Judge Chambers Gray, 76% of Black defendants (112 out of 148 on an average night), 40% of Hispanic White defendants (21 out of 52 on an average night), and 55% of non-Hispanic White defendants (65 out of 117 on an average night) were detained in Harris County Jail because they couldn't afford money bail.

Judge Chambers Gray's racial difference in the share detained due to inability to pay for Black and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 50% best in Harris County. Her racial difference in the share detained due to inability to pay for Hispanic and Non-Hispanic White defendants is among the 25% worst in Harris County.
